Ugly Duck is based in an old Victorian tannery. The sharings will take place on the ground floor only (Yard, Garage and Hub), which has step free access and is wheelchair accessible.

@Disturbance Opening Hours

Tickets are between £8 and £20 on a sliding scale providing options for everybody. They can be purchased online here or at the door on the day. You won't be asked for any ID/proof. We just ask that you are honest. No one will be turned away for lack of funds please contact general@uglyduck.org.uk if needed.

Getting here

By Road:

- Ugly Duck is situated on Tanner Street, just outside of London Congestion Zone.
- Some onsite parking is available on Tanner Street. As it's public parking, it is not possible to reserve it.

By Bus:

Bus stops are situated nearby the venue. Closest bus stops are:



- Bus Stop C (Druid Street)
- Bus stop M (Abbey Street)
- Bus Stop B (Tanner Street)

By Train:

The closest train station is London Bridge, approximately 13 mins walk. The station has step-free access to and between all platforms, at all times trains are running, via level access, lifts or ramps.

By Underground:

The closest underground stations are:

- London Bridge (Jubilee Line, Northern Line, National Train Services): 13 mins walk
- Bermondsey (Jubilee Line): 15 mins walk
- Tower Gateway (DLR): 19 mins walk
- Tower Hill (Circle Line, District Line): 21 mins walk

Getting around the building

- The ground floor of the location is wheelchair accessible.
- The main entrance for the event is via the car park gate (image below)





- A bar with alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks will be available outside in the yard
- The entrance to the performance space is through the green garage doors (image below)



Facilities & Access

Toilet Facilities

- Accessible, gender neutral toilets are available in the Hub on the ground floor, on the right hand side of the bar. Cubicles are on the right side, while urinals are on the left. **A wheelchair accessible toilet is situated in between.**

Water points

- Tap water will be available at the bar and all the taps in the toilet facilities have drinking water. Cups will be available at the bar on the ground floor. Water fountains will be dotted around.



Quieter Room

- A quieter room will be available in the Hub, on the ground floor. Please note that this space will not be completely secluded or private. Ear defenders will be available (see note on ear defenders below)

Sitting Arrangements

- The performances will take place in different spaces of the venue, so the audience will be required to move around in between. However, there will be plenty of seating options available

BSL

The events will be BSL interpreted. There will be a BSL interpreter floating around for conversations.

Caption

All performances, videos, and installations will include some form of captioning, rehearsed by the artists and the team during the residency who received advice from access consultants.

The captions are not delivered to a professional standard and the Deaf community was not involved in the process.

Audio Description

All performances, videos, and installations will include some Audio Description, rehearsed by the artists and the team during the residency who received advice & training from visually impaired access consultants

Traffic Light System

This event operates a traffic light system. We encourage everybody to wear a traffic light sticker indicating what kind of interaction they're open to. These stickers enhance awareness when approaching others, ensuring everyone feels comfortable and respected when interacting with others.



Green Sticker: I am happy to speak with everyone

Yellow Sticker: I feel comfortable speaking with only the people I know

Red Sticker: At the moment, I don't feel comfortable being approached

Covid Safety

To keep each other safe, we ask all visitors to wear a mask during the event, unless you are exempt.

Covid tests will be provided on site.

Ear Defenders

Due to live performances at the event, some uncontrolled high level of sound or noise might occur. Ear plugs will be available on site to assist with noise reduction if needed.

Support Dogs

Support dogs are welcomed in the space. Drinking bowls will be provided.

Good Hosts

Good Hosts will be available for supporting you with any accessibility needs. Look out for Folks in yellow vests. We encourage attendees to get in touch if they wish to discuss anything specific ahead of the event.
